

LRC Coimbatore facilitated to get bus pass to the PWDs who are attending classes regularly in coordination with Government department. The PWDs and their caretakers were provided with lunch and refreshment.





Differently abled and mobilization and job fair camp 2016

Students gained knowledge through this camp in the form of a) how to communicate the weaker sections b) work with other male counterparts in the camp. c) Knowledge on voluntary participation in societal wellness.


